Happy New Year!

We have a packed programme of arts and entertainment events for you at our temporary venues in Musselburgh and Haddington!

As we go to press, we do not have an update on how long we will be out of The Brunton. In March 2023 we were forced to close our performance spaces in The Brunton building due to the presence of reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete (RAAC) in the roof. Whilst we await more information regarding the next steps, we have established a successful programme at venues in Musselburgh, including Loretto School Theatre and Northesk Parish Church, and Corn Exchange in Haddington.

Highlights at Loretto Theatre in Musselburgh include midweek movies, National Theatre Live and Royal Opera House Live screenings and at Northesk Church, fabulous classical concerts for lunchtime and evenings.

We have installed new bespoke sound, lighting and stage design at the Corn Exchange, Haddington, along with comfy seats! Highlights at Corn Exchange include comedy with Craig Hill, fantastic tribute bands such as Totally Tina and Lionel – The Music of Lionel Richie and high profile events such as An Evening with Snooker Greats.

We urge you to join us at one of our new venues, to experience the same quality of arts and entertainment that you have come to expect from The Brunton.
